



**F**ield **D**ay is perhaps the biggest event in an amateur radio operator's year but what exactly IS Field Day?

Some say it is an **emergency preparedness event** as operators are encouraged to operate under emergency conditions where generators, coolers, portable antennas and grills are used.

Others say it is a **contest** as operators and clubs are encouraged to log their contacts and submit their scores to the ARRL, hopeful for recognition.

Field Day is also an event that challenges and sharpens the operator's skills during often difficult HF operation (phone and CW)!

I personally think Field Day is **ALL** of these as well as a great time to be outdoors on a Summer weekend with friends while participating in the the best event of the year!

However you decide to describe Field Day, don't forget to enjoy the outdoors, weather and companionship of the event!



# Winlink Follow-up

Since we had our Winlink sessions back in winter, I'm wondering how many have set up Winlink; and how many previous users decided to dust it off, update and start using it again?

Ok, so you set it up, or became reacquainted. But what do you do with this tool? Maybe send one message to the Red Cross because there was an event. Ok, that means I need to fiddle with "forms" and all that. Is that all there is to Winlink? NO!

There are "nets" that exist weekly so that you can keep your skills sharp and explore other functions of the program. One of the most widely known is "Winlink Wednesday". It started as a Virgina EMCOMM exercise and slowly spread out to a weekly event that has world-wide participation. Not bad for a little Commonwealth just South of Pennsylvania (another commonwealth??). What started as 2970 messages in one year has blossomed out to 33,537 messages last year, and this year looks like it will top that number as well. (see chart).

Winlink Wednesday is just one net that exists, and it's pretty easy to participate, especially here in the Lehigh Valley. Did you know that the Lehigh Valley is fortunate to have THREE Winlink nodes here in the valley. There is a 40-meter HF node, and two on VHF. Many people had trouble reaching the Macungie node W3PLG-5 on VHF. Now there is a node at Savercool. Most everyone should be able to get into W3PLG-6 (144.970).


So what do you have to do? Check in to Winlink Wednesday by sending a Winlink message to the Net Control Station during a Wednesday (Eastern Standard Time). Once you start, you'll get a reminder from the NCS each Tuesday that provides information about the upcomming net. Some weeks you simply send the standard report (Call Sign, Name, Town, County, State, and mode). Other weeks a weather report, or an ICS-213. All of this information is available on the Winlink Wednesday website along with weekly check-in statistics, historical check-in statistics and all sorts of net information. There's even a PDF that you can download that walks you through opening, completing and attaching the ICS-213.

I know you are asking yourself, "what good is historical tracking, unless there's some cool prize attached". You would be correct in that assumption. And, there is a super cool recognition attached to your historical check-in record. After 100 valid check-in's you will have achieved the Winlink Wednesday Century Award. If you check in 100 weeks in a row, you can earn that certificate in 1.9 years, or 23 months. But, don't worry, if you miss a week or two, you don't start over at the beginning. Add another 23 months of check-in's and you'll get a 200 endorsement. Yes, there are many stations that have hit that milestone. How many participants have earned the Century Club Recognition? At the time of this article, 317!

If you have questions, comments, or need some assistance getting on Winlink, and sending and receiving messages, please reach out. We have an active group of Winlink users in the club that use Winlink to communicate about ham radio and ham radio events weekly.
