What is Winlink?

- Winlink is a network of amateur radio and authorized government stations that provide worldwide radio email using radio pathways where the internet is not present.
- The system is built, operated and administered entirely by licensed "Ham" volunteers.
- It supports email with attachments, position reporting, weather and information bulletins, and is well-known for its role in interoperable emergency and disaster relief communications.
- *It is capable of operating completely without the internet--automatically--using smart-network radio relays.*



WHY?

- Familiar format
- Easy integration / interoperability
- Bridge into established email systems
- Know and familiar to served agencies
- Utilization of standardized text service for message distribution (traffic) minimizes downstream handoff errors.
 - EXAMPLE

HOW?

- **1st** – You will need a client
 - Winlink accounts are created with a client program, you cannot create one on the host website.
 - **Accounts require** – **A valid amateur radio license**, or a license or authorization from a participating government service or agency (GMRS, LMR, ship station, other marine, or general radiotelephone licenses DO NOT qualify)
 - Download and install any client software, follow the program's instructions on account creation and your account will be created. Be sure to include a password recovery address.
 - Multiple clients are available, **Winlink Express** is recommended



HOW?

- 2nd You need a connection

- Telnet

- This is a plain old internet connection. However you normally connect to the internet. Yes, Winlink will work as an email client on the internet with a normal internet connection.

- RF

- Where the fun begins and you bridge the final mile, or 1,000 miles if that's what is needed.
